


























Sports days are events staged by many schools in which people participate in competitive sporting activities, often with the aim of winning trophies or prizes. Sports day will encourage young people to stay healthy and avoid unwanted illness. Sports also will help improve mental and physical health. Moving around can improve cardiovascular fitness, and increase bone density. It can also help reduce blood sugar levels, and strengthen lungs.

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This year, the Early Years Sports Day programme took place on Friday 7th of April 2023 with parents and family members in attendance. This event was divided into two sessions; in the first session, children were following their house teams to complete a carousel of activities that they have been learning in the Multi Skills unit. In the second session, children were taking part in a house relay race called 'steal the treasure' where the winning team was determined by having the most treasures in their houses. Congratulations to the BK team for winning 1st place in the overall event followed by Naga as the runner-up while Harimau and Rusa came in 3rd and 4th place. In the key stage 4 event we had a very high turnout of students with some houses having 3 teams! This is the largest number of participants we have ever had and great fun was had by all. Overall winners of the event were Naga 2 with Naga 1 coming in second and BK 3 in 3rd place.

Overall a very successful and busy and successful year from the PE team.








Co Curricula Activities


