

What have we been learning this week



This week in nursery, the children explored the "Hello Words" subtopic from our "Chattering Children" unit, engaging in fun activities like "Letters," "Who Am I," "Words," and "Parcel." We began with an Entry Point activity to help everyone feel comfortable and get to know each other, encouraging language exploration through play. In math, the focus was on comparing "more than," "fewer than," and "same as" using hands-on materials. For literacy, the children enjoyed nursery rhymes, crafting, and tracing activities. In phonics, we introduced Set 1 sounds, where they learned new words and practiced sound writing with their fine motor skills.



This week, our students dove into formal lessons with engaging classroom activities! In Literacy, they explored *The Very Quiet Cricket*, engaging in storytelling, learning new vocabulary, making meaningful marks, recognizing initial sounds, and using pictures to retell the story. In Maths, they honed their skills by matching pairs, sorting items, and recognizing sets for counting and grouping. In IEYC, our week began with a creative entry point, crafting treasure boxes, and students also learned mindfulness through breath counting and nasal breathing for self-regulation. We wrapped up with laughter challenges, sparking joy and social connections!



Year I

This week has been a fun learning with for the students. We had our IPC unit, brainwave exit point! Students are excited to start their new IPC unit, Who am I? In English we focused on sequencing of a story and labeling pictures. In math we are still working through our place value unit. This week we have focused on concepts such as one less, one more, counting backwards.



Year 2

This week has been full of fun and learning! In English, they've been having a blast with "Giraffes Can't Dance," where they've mastered the art of creating complete sentences with expanded noun phrases. Over in Math, our number wizards have been practicing writing numbers up to 100 in both words and expanded form, and beginning to use number lines to count in 10s and 1s. In IPC, the children wrapped up their "Brainwave" unit by exploring what makes them unique and writing heartfelt letters to their families. They're now excitedly jumping into our new unit, "The Earth: Our Home," where they'll discover materials, animal groups, and habitats through a series of engaging activities.



Year 3

Did you know your brain is like a muscle? Year 3 does!

This week, we have been all about our brains during IPC learning time. We made posters with interesting facts about our brains and worked collaboratively to make a class puzzle about Menara Condong. In English, we now can use imperative verbs and time connectives in our instructional sentences. In Maths, we are now experts at recognising, partitioning and using on a number line numbers to 1,000!



Year 4

We had a fantastic experience learning about emotional regulation with Ms. Syahira this week, as part of our IPC unit of 'Brainwave'

Year 4 continued to work on place value and explored numbers up to 10000, as well as using number line with different intervals.

The children also began to work on non-chronological reports by examining their features.

What have we been learning this week



Year 5 had an amazing week of learning, delving even deeper into our "Brainwave" IPC topic. They put their teamwork skills to the test at the memory skills station, embracing challenges with a growth mindset. They also learned how to manage their emotions by using mindfulness strategies to calm themselves down. In English, they continued reading James and The Giant Peach, becoming more curious and excited about James' adventure. They also worked on identifying key vocabulary to describe the settings of well-known stories like Harry Potter, Matilda, and Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, adding a creative twist with alternative settings.

Lastly, in Maths, they grew more confident in their Mental Maths skills, improving their use of the number line and comparing numbers up to 1 million. We look forward to diving into a new IPC unit next week!



Year 6

Year 6 started their Bake it! topic for IPC. "Bake It!" explores the science, history, and culture of baking, alongside practical skills in food preparation. The unit provides an interdisciplinary approach, combining elements of science, history, design technology, and more. In English, they are learning the persuasive writing techniques (AFOREST) to create an advert for IPC Bake it! For reading, we have started chapter 3 and 4 of The Wild Before book together with comprehension questions. Student also highlighted tricky words while reading. For math, we continue with Place Value, learning to compare, order and round any integers as well as operations of negative numbers.




PE
