What have we been learning this week



This week was filled with exciting activities in IEYC as the children enjoyed listening to stories about famous bears and followed instructions while making honey cornflakes. They practiced fun tongue twisters and completed a smiley face activity, focusing on listening and following directions. In math, they explored songs and stories with repeated language, recognizing simple patterns, clapping along to songs, and participating in group singing. For literacy, the children listened to Goldilocks and the Three Bears, practiced retelling and sequencing the story, and created their own front and back covers for it. In phonics, they focused on the sounds b, f, e, and l, using picture sound cards and tracing letters to reinforce recognition and pronunciation.

Year I

Year 1 has had fun this week! We are still working on our IPC unit who am I? This week we have focused on learning about our own history.

In math we have been learning number bonds, and fact families! It has been great to see students grow more confident with their numeracy skills.

In English we have been focusing on writing simple instructions using our sequencing words, first, next, then and last.

What a busy week!



Year 2

This week has been buzzing with excitement in our classrooms! In Math, we wrapped up our Place Value unit and dove into Addition & Subtraction. In English, we introduced text mapping, which helped our children retell "Giraffes Can't Dance", ready to craft their own versions next week. We also enjoyed "Sophie's Snail" and practiced our retrieval skills with some fun questions! Meanwhile, in IPC, students eagerly constructed their bee houses and learned about the four seasons and the impact humans have on our world. It was a fantastic week of learning and creativity.



Year 3

In Maths this week, we began by reflecting on our recent EOU assessment on Place Value. We enjoyed celebrating our progress and looking at our next learning steps.

In English, we read, 'The Day the Crayons Quit!'. Following this we crafted our own letters, explaining why our own crayons might decide to leave our pencil cases! We have also been exploring how to edit our writing and why this is important.

Finally, our IPC learning! We have been busy researching and recording the materials of different properties, such as magnetism and conductors/ insulators.



Year 4

In Maths, the children began their unit addition and subtraction by learning how add 2 4-digit numbers with and without exchanging.

The children completed their nonchronological reports and were able to assess their work against success criteria.

In IPC, Year 4 worked on how animals adapt to their habitat by behaviour and structure. We also had fun looking at children's baby photos when learning about the human life cycle.

What have we been learning this week



Year 5

This week 5N led a fantastic Primary assembly about Enviornmental Sustainability. They shared with the rest of Primary the importance of Reducing, Reusing and Recycling.

This also linked with our continued learning in IPC as we have been discovering about the role of pollen and pollinator in pollination, the different ways that plants can reproduce by themselves and also conducting investigations to find out the best condition for a seed to germinate.

In English, we have been enjoying innovating the story of 'Thumbelina' and planning our own five-

point plot story.

In Maths, we have been having many good struggles whilst we use rounding to estimate our answers to our addition and subtraction questions and the inverse operation to check if our answer is correct.



Year 6

Year 6 continue their science investigation for IPC this week. They are learning the science of heating and cooling materials by doing investigations on conductors and insulators. They also learn about baking ingredients and world hunger as well. In English, they are planning for the persuasive writing essay paragraphs using the AFOREST techniques as well as simile, metaphors and the 5 senses. For reading, we have started chapter 9 and 10 of The Wild Before book, together with comprehension questions. Students also highlighted tricky words while reading. For math, we continue with Four Operations topic .This week we learn about solving problem with multiplication, factors, short division and long divisions.

Year 6: Note values (2/4,3/4, and 4/4 time signature)




PE


