None of this would be possible without your continued support and feedback. It has been wonderful meeting so many of you this term, and I really appreciate your support and trust.



What have we been learning this week

Year 4

In Maths, the children completed their 'Addition and Subtraction' unit, which concluded with the end of unit assessment. We began the next unit on 'Area', which will be continued after half-term.

During English lessons, there was a focus on reading comprehension to support children with their reading assessment.

The classes performed fantastically well during the IPC Exit Points, as seen by the many parents that visited.

What have we been learning this week



We began this week by getting our hands grubby with the Free Tree Society as we planted an edible garden featuring basil, eggplant, okra, lemongrass and pandan leaves. Year 5 also have shown themselves to be collaborative and communicative learners as they have worked hard to prepare for our Exit Point today. We look forward to sharing our learning directly with parents and teachers as we inspire each other with our botanical knowledge and skills.

In Maths, we have learnt to identify and recognise common factors and multiples. This has reinforced the importance of our times tables so the students have also been challenged to answer multiplication mental maths questions as speedily and as accurately as possible.

In English, we have finished writing our short stories using similes, metaphors and sensory description. A key skill as a writer is to proofread and edit the work and the students have developed their knowledge of how to check back and make changes to their writing as well as make suggestions to their friends about how they could improve their writing.



Year 6

Year 6 continue their Bake it! for IPC this week. They are doing their research on world hunger and getting ready for their Exit Point next week. In English, they are writing their first draft for persuasive writing essay paragraphs using the AFOREST techniques as well as simile, metaphors and the 5 senses. The big write for Advert writing will also be completed this week. For reading, we have started chapter 11 and 12 of The Wild Before book, together with comprehension questions. Students also highlighted tricky words while reading. For math, we continue with Four Operations topic .This week we learn about divisions with remainders, and multi step problem solving.

Year 2: Study reflection "High and low sound" Year 3: Study reflection "Rhythm and pulse". Year 4: Study reflection "Music math and percussion solo".


Year 5: Study reflection "Rhythm poems" Year 6: Study reflection "Note values (2/4,3/4, and 4/4 time signature)".
