Dear Secondary Parents,

This week is the final week of a half-term in which we have made many positive adjustments to our secondary provision at Straits International School Rawang. At every turn, our wonderful secondary students have taken the new information on board and reacted incredibly impressively. Similarly, I am also delighted with the manner in which you – our secondary parents – have fed back about the many changes put in place, and I am genuinely grateful for your ongoing support.

It was clear to me when I started at the school at the beginning of term one that we needed to improve our communication with parents. To this end, we immediately implemented weekly newsletters to both primary and secondary parents (as well as a weekly CP letter), and sought to provide both easier online access and user-friendly opportunities for you to meet with teachers and leaders in school whenever you needed to. Our parent café, for example, is intended for this very purpose, namely – a place where you can not only feel welcomed but also interact with the adults who support your children in school each day.

One of the most important pieces of communication which you have received was in September and is something which we will repeat now at the beginning of each half-term. Our Curriculum Overviews are documents which will map our curriculum provision in detail so that all members of our community – parents, students & teachers – are clear about what happens when, what the lesson content is, what excellence looks like and when assessments will take place. I would urge parents to study these documents regularly so that they can remain fully-informed about the curriculum content which their child is studying at each stage of the academic year.



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We have also placed a very deliberate focus upon student leadership and student empowerment so far this term. Our student leadership teams are now in place and cover many key areas – not only in terms of decision making but also with regards to supporting the welfare and wellbeing of our wider community. In addition, we are providing opportunities for students to showcase their musical talents each Friday as their peers enter school – an initiative which I know has gone well with those who have witnessed the amazing performances! Alongside this we have also refreshed some of our internal expectations around student behaviour and I am happy with the response of students in all year groups. The climate in our school is positive, purposeful and welcoming, with all students understanding what is expected of them each day. When the culture of a school is positive, then success usually follows.

Next term, of course, we expect to see the permanent arrival of Mr. Simon – our new Head of Secondary. I know that many parents have already met Mr. Simon at our recent coffee morning but I would ask those who haven't yet liaised with him to get to know him as well as they can once he is with us full-time. Mr. Simon will be a very important contact for parents over the coming terms and academic years so a purposeful and productive professional relationship is absolutely in everyone's best interests.

Finally this week, parents are directed towards our ISAMS parent portal, and more specifically to the page which contains our key school policies. Under the 'school information' tab, there is a section where you are able to indicate that you have read and understood the policies in place in our school.

	In EFL, students explored and examined the tenor, vehicle and ground for the poem A case of Murder and examined whether the boy was entirely to blmae.
Y7	In ESL, students wrote a descriptive essay about a festival or celebration using advanced adjectives.
V0	In EFL, students explored the dual persomality of Sherlock Holmes.
Y8	In ESL, students wrote a report on improvements in school buildings and facilities using own opinions.

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students learned on ordering decimals, adding and subtracting decimals as well as multiplying decimals.
Y8	Students learned on ordering decimals, multiplying and dividing by decimals.
Y9	Students learned operations involving fractions.
Y10	Students learned on cubic and special sequences and recurring decimals.
YII	Students learned on finding the exact value for trigonometry without using the calculator and also learned on sines, cosines and tangents of angles greater than 90 degrees.
Y10 Add Math	Students learned quadratic inequalities.
Yll Add Math	Studets learned on the basic arithmetic and also the sum of an arithmetic progresion.

SCIENCE

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students recapped all the topics on forces and completed a quiz.
Y8	Students continued learning about pressure in liquids, solids, and turning forces while exploring real-world applications.
Y9	Students learned to form chemical equation and balancing the equation.
Y10	Combined Science - Students explored advantages and disadvantages of different energy resources and efficiency calculation. Physics - Students learned impulse, force and momentum. Biology - Students explored the types biological molecule found in living things. Chemistry - Students learnt how to calculate the relative molecular/formula masses, % composition & % purity of substances.
Y11	Combined Science - Students explored methods of salt preparation, flame test, cation test, anion test and gas identification test. Physics - Students learned about the Earth, occurance of day and night and occurance of four seasons. Biology - Students compared and contrasted sexual and asexual reproduction in plants Chemistry - Students explored the components in environmental chemistry - air & water.



PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES HUMANITIES

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
	Enterprise - students learnt about how stakeholders are affected or why are they interested in the operation of the enterprise.
Y7	History - Students learned about New Babylon and the Code of Hammurabi, followed by presenting a case as part of an activity.
Y8	Enterprise - students learnt about SWOT Analysis and did the analysis for the school.
	History, students learnt about the first five wives of Henry VIII and offered advice to Catherine Parr.
Y9	Enterprise - students learnt why monitoring action plans is important to an enterprise project.
19	History - Students further examined how the assassination led to the outbreak of World War I, examining how alliances played an important part.



Y10	In Global Perspectives, students researched past and current conflicts, exploring their causes. They then shared their findings with their classmates.
	In Travel and Tourism, students were introduced to the topic of global tourism by researching a destination somewhere other than Malaysia, and exploring various factors. They then shared their presentations with their classmates.
	Business - students learnt the features, advantages and disadvantages of public corporations. They also practised some exam-style questions.
	Economics - students learnt about price elasticity of supply. They practised some examstyle questions.
	History - Students examined the causes of the Manchurain Crisis and how the League reacted to it.
	In Travel and Tourism, students continued their exploration of factors affecting marketing by applying their knowledge to a case study. They also focused on the best way to answer 9-mark questions, and put their skills into practice with exam-style questions.
	Business - students learnt about the sources of finance. They also practised some exam-style questions.
Y11	Economics - students learnt about inflation and deflation. They also practised some exam-style questions.
	Global Perspective - Students carried out their team project, collected evidence and have started working on writing their reports for team project.

PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES MANDARIN

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Mandarin Advanced: This week, the students learned the passage about 《整容过后的那些囧事》 and reviewed and revisited previously learned topics. Mandarin Intermediate: This week, Year 7 Mandarin Intermediate students focused on writing a short essay about "What I did in a day", applying the topics they developed throughout the half-term.
Y8	Mandarin Advanced: This week, Year 8 Mandarin Advanced students explored the differences between "的," "地," and "得." They engaged in discussions about how each character functions in sentences, including its grammatical role and usage. Mandarin Intermediate: This week, students learned essential vocabulary such as 天气 (weather), 晴天 (sunny), 雨 (rain), and 温度 (temperature). They practiced forming sentences to describe the weather, like 今天是晴天 (Today is sunny) and 今天的温度是30度 (Today's temperature is 30 degree). Listening exercises included understanding weather forecasts, while speaking practice involved discussing the weather in different places. Cultural aspects, such as how weather varies across regions in China, are also explored to deepen understanding.
Y 9	Mandarin Advanced: This week, the Year 9 Advanced Mandarin class learned about the Chinese culture. The students learned about Chinese culture, including the 文房四宝(笔纸砚墨)、中国四大发明(造纸术、火药、活字印刷术、指南针)和中国娱乐游戏(麻将、牌九、象棋、围棋). Mandarin Intermediate: This week, students expanded their vocabulary related to school life, learning words such as 教室 (classroom), 作业 (homework), 老师 (teacher). They practiced using the words in sentences like 我今天有很多作业 (I have a lot of homework today) and 我们的教室很大 (Our classroom is big). Listening activities included dialogues about school routines, while speaking exercises involved describing their own school day. Cultural discussions covered school systems in China, comparing them with those in other countries to enhance cultural awareness.

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y10	Mandarin as First Language: This week, Year 10 First Language Chinese students began the new topic "价值观念" by reading the short novel 《超人》 (Superman) by 冰心. They focused on understanding the themes and cultural implications presented in the text. Mandarin as Second Language: This week, the students studied the topic of friendship and also wrote an essay: "友情的力量:一个改变你生活的朋友." Mandarin as Foreign Language: This week, the students studied the topic of school life.
Y11	Mandarin as First Language: This week, Year 11 First Language Chinese students read an excerpt from the text 《蟋蟀》 (Cricket) by 陆蠡. They focused on comprehension skills, analyzing the narrative and identifying key themes and literary devices used in the text. Mandarin as Second Language: This week, students explored the toipc of customs and food culture. They learned about traditional Chinese customs, focusing on how food plays a central role in celebrations and daily life. Key vocabulary such as 饺子 (dumplings), and 春节 (Spring Festival) was introduced. Students discussed dishes they had tried, using phrases like 我吃过饺子 (I had eaten dumplings) and 我们学习了春节的习俗 (We had learned about Spring Festival customs). Listening activities involved cultural stories, while discussions reflected on how Chinese food culture differs from their own experiences. Mandarin as Foregn Language: This week, students focused on the theme of learning Chinese. They reviewed their language-learning experiences, discussing challenges they had faced and strategies they had used to overcome them. Key vocabulary included terms like 语言技能 (language skills), 听力 (listening), 口语 (speaking). Students shared thoughts on their journey, using phrases such as 学习中文很有挑战 (Learning Chinese had been challenging) and 我已经提高了我的听力 (I had already improved my listening). They listened to others' experiences and reflected on the significance of Mandarin in global communication.
