**ENGLISH** 

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	<b>English First Language</b> , students have examined the metaphors in the poen Tyger, Tyger by William Blake
1,	<b>English Second Language</b> , students compared celebrations around the world and shared experiences about CNY, Deepavali, Maslenitsa and Raya.
Y8	<b>English First Language</b> , students have compared two openings of two differnt books by Arthur Conan Doyle.
10	<b>English Second Language</b> , students explored classic designs and explained the versatility of Polo T-shirts, Volkswagen cars etc.
VO	<b>English First Language</b> -In First Language English, students have been looking at how to spot fake news and have been learning how to consume news media responsibly.
Y9	<b>English Second Language</b> - In ESL, students described moods and feelings and explored how to keep a cool head.
Y10	<b>English First Language</b> - In First Language English, students have been writing poetry and descriptions, as well as doing some assessment preparation on Paper 1, Question 1.
	English Second Language - In ESL, students wrote a review about a restaurant and TV-programme and explored all types of transportation.
	<b>English Literature</b> - In English Literature, students have focused on Chapter 5 of 'Things Fall Apart'.
YII	<b>English First Language &amp; Literature</b> - In First Language English/Literature, students have finished reading Part 1 of 'Things Fall Apart' and are moving on to Part 2. They have written mini essays in preparation for their assessments next week.
	<b>English Second Language</b> -In ESL, students did a research on food issues to resolve food wastage, food shortage, lab-grown meat and organic plantations.



### PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES MATHEMATICS

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students learned on rounding numbers to a given number of decimal places.
Y8	Students learned on rounding numbers to a given number of significant figures.
Y9	Students learned to use formulas to calculate the missing angles in a regular and irregular polygons.
Y10	Students learned to ind the nth term in linear, quadratic and cubic sequences.
YII	Students learned on finding the exact trigonometric ratios using pythagoras and basic trigonometry.
Y10	Students learned to write quadratics expressions using completed form and sketching graphs with labelling the turning point from completed form.
YII	Students learned to use Pascal's triangle and binomial theorem for expansion (a + b)^n



#### **PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES**

#### **SCIENCE**

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students explored about gravitational potential energy and kinetic energy, gaining an understanding of the formulas and calculations involved.
Y8	Students have explored pressure in gases and fluids, discussing the factors that influence gas pressure. They are also learned how fluids apply pressure in all directions and how to calculate fluid pressure.
Y9	Students explored on difference between covalent and ionic bonding and they were introduced to basic idea of naming chemical compounds.
Y10	Biology - Students explored, described and investigated diffusion, osmosis & active transport.  Chemistry - Students described the giant covalent structures of diamonds, graphite & silica as well as explored the metallic bonding that exists within metals.  Physics - Studnets continued practising on principle of moments and then were introduced to momentum.  Combined Science - Students investigated on different sources of energy and energy transfer methods.



Y11	Biology - Students researched the differences between nervous system vs the endocrine system as well as described the vital functions of the endocrine glands.  Chemistry - Students described and explored the reactivity series, displacement reactions & the rusting of iron.  Physics - Students explored electromotive force induction, dc motors, factors affecting direct current motor and introduction to alternating current motor.  Combined Science - Students learned on formulas related to power, voltage, current and energy, choosing of fuse and factors affecting chemical changes.



### PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES HUMANITIES

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	History - Students have explored how Mesopotamia was conquered by the Babylonians and Assyrians, and they have also studied the Code of Hammurabi.  Enterprise - Enterprise - students explored the Enterprise Capabilities. They did group discussions and answered some questions.
Y8	History - Students have examined Henry's actions aftrer his first marriage and the Dissolution of the Monasteries  Enterprise - students learnt about different types of risks an enterprise may encounter and how to manage the risks through risk assessment.
<b>Y</b> 9	History - History - Students have explored whether Germany wanted a war in 1914 and the short-term causes of World War I.  Enterprise - Enterprise - students learnt about Action Plan. They learnt the stages of Action Plan and did a group activity on this.



Y10	History - Students have examined the successes and failures of the League of Nations in the 1920s.  Travel and Tourism - Travel & Tourism - This week, students completed a case study focused on different types of tourist, and were introduced to the next topic, types of destinations.  Business - students learnt how to answer a 12-mark IGCSE question by watching a video and answered an exam question. They also learnt about Multinational Companies.  Economics - students learnt about Price Elasticity of Demand and practiced exam-style questions.  Global Perspectives - This week, students continued working on their research reports regarding ecosystem loss.
Y11	History - Students have examined sources about the Korean War and begun to examine the Cuban Revolution.  Global Perspectives - In Global Perspectives, students continued their writing of Individual Reports to 500 words, out of 2000 words.  Business - students learnt about Quality Control & Quality Assurance. They also did group presentations on Location Decisions.  Economics - students learnt about Economics Growth and Unemployment. They completed some past-year questions and a worksheet.  Travel and Tourism - In Travel & Tourism - Students learned about the elements of marketing in travel and tourism, and completed some exam-style questions on a case study.

Y7	This week, students completed their artwork and prepared for their presentations, which will take place next week as part of their minor assessment.

Through this process, they learned how to combine different materials, textures, and methods, gaining insights into the possibilities of mixed media art and expanding their creative abilities.
Y11	Students preparing their preparatory work for Component 1, refining their skills, techniques, and ideas to ensure their coursework meets the assessment criteria and showcases their creative development.



### PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES MANDARIN

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	This week, the Year 7 Mandarin Beginner class built upon the knowledge gained over the past half-term by completing additional exercises focused on dates and time. These activities helped to reinforce their understanding in preparation for next week's minor assessment. This week, the Year 7 Advanced Mandarin class studied the topic of weight loss. The students learned about the importance and methods of body management in modern times through an article. They also reviewed previous topics to prepare for a test next week.
Y8	This week, the Year 8 Advanced Mandarin class made significant progress in our study of the text "国庆长假出国游". In addition to analyzing the text, students participated in listening exercises that highlighted the advantages and disadvantages of traveling abroad. Year 8 Mandarin Beginner class this week, students expanded their knowledge of leisure activities by learning new vocabulary such as 旅游 (traveling), 打电玩 (playing video games), and 野餐 (picnicking). They practiced expressing their preferences using sentences like 我喜欢去公园野餐 (I like to have picnics in the park).
<b>Y</b> 9	This week, the Year 9 Advanced Mandarin class studied the topic of volunteer work. Through the article, students learned about the impact and contributions of volunteering to society. Additionally, students wrote a diary entry about their experiences during the COVID-19 pandemic. This week, Year 9 Mandarin Beginner class students continued learning about sickness, focusing on more complex vocabulary such as 流感 (flu), 咳嗽 (cough), and 嗓子疼 (sore throat). They practiced describing symptoms in detail using phrases like 我发烧还有咳嗽 (I have a fever and a cough).



Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y10	This week, the Year 10 Chinese First Language class studied the text "被放逐的皇后" and completed comprehension exercises. In addition, they explored the Classical Chinese text "猩猩嗜酒," focusing on understanding the grammar and vocabulary used in Classical Chinese. This week, the Year 10 Mandarin as a Foreign Language class studied the topic of school life. The students learned content, vocabulary, and grammar through various articles. The Year 10 Second Language Mandarin class focused on planning after high school graduation, discussing whether to continue further education or enter the workforce.
Y11	This week, the Year 11 Chinese First Language class engaged in a discussion about the theme of "Loneliness" and wrote a directed writing piece on the topic. This week, Year 11 Chinese Foreign Language students deepened their understanding of Chinese festivals, focusing on the traditions and customs associated with major celebrations. They learned vocabulary related to specific festival activities, such as 燃放鞭炮 (setting off foreworks) for 春节 (Spring Festival), and 吃月饼 (eating mooncakes) for 中秋节 (Mid-Autumn Festival). This week, Year 11 Chinese Second Language students continued their study of Chinese customs and food culture, focusing on dining etiquette and traditional mealtime practices. They learned key phrases like 请慢用 (enjoy your meal) and 干杯 (cheers), along with the customs surrounding family-style meals and the use of chopsticks.



### PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES BAHASA

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	The Year 7 students focused on their revision for minor assessments, mainly on writing and grammar within the context of Unit 2: Ungkapan Masa.
Y8	The Year 8 students focused on their revision for minor assessments, specifically on writing and grammar within the context of Unit 8: Makanan dan Minuman dari Serata Dunia.
Y9	The Year 9 students focused on their revision for minor assessments, specifically on writing and tatabahasa (grammar), within the context of Unit 13: Perayaan dan Majlis Istimewa.
Y10	The Year 10 students continued their final section of Unit 19: Alam Semula Jadi. Alongside this, they are preparing for their upcoming minor assessment based on the same unit, while also focusing on developing their writing skills centered around 'aktiviti perkelahan'.
Y11	The Year 11 students continued with Unit 27: Pendidikan dan Latihan Lepasan Sekolah, focusing on their minor assessment, which emphasizes surat kiriman tidak rasmi (informal letter writing) and comprehension questions.

Y7	This week, 7R started their first badminton lesson which focused on serving and lobbing. 7S began their athletics unit with a lesson on short and long distance running.	
Y8	This week, 8R started their first badminton lesson which focused on serving and lobbing. 8S began their athletics unit with a lesson on short and long distance running.
