## STUDENT LED LEARNING CONFERENCE YOU, YOUR CHILD & THEIR TEACHER DATE NOVEMBER 25, 2024







#### What have we been learning this week



This week, we learned about self-care and healthy habits through exciting IEYC activities, focusing on the importance of brushing teeth, exploring our bones, and discovering different types of food to encourage healthy eating. In literacy, we practiced the nursery rhyme Miss Polly, learning new words like "doctor," "Dolly." and "pills" to build vocabulary and language skills. In math, we explored numbers 1, 2, and 3 with fruit-based counting activities, helping students recognize and sequence numbers through hands-on experiences. For phonics, we continued practicing the sounds "sh," "th," and ch," working on identifying and pronouncing these sounds accurately. Through these activities, children had fun while developing essential skills in language, math, and self-care.



This week, we continued our literacy journey with The Giraffe Who Can't Dance. Students practiced writing speech bubbles and captions for story pictures, using their knowledge of letter sounds to bring characters' words to life.

In Maths, we focused on numbers 1-5, paying particular attention to 4 and 5. The students enjoyed a series of fun consolidation activities and ended the week with a checkpoint to reinforce their understanding.

For IEYC Learning Block 3: My Family & Me, students engaged in creative activities that celebrated their personal connections and daily routines. They drew diagrams of their family homes, added drawings or writings about skills they've mastered in their scrapbooks, crafted their own toys from materials, made festive birthday hats, and illustrated their daily routines. It was a vibrant week filled with exploration, creativity, and reflection on family life!



Year 1 has had a busy week! In English we have been writing simple stories and applying all our learning from this unit. In IPC we have been reseearching about different celebrations and artefacts. Students have finished the shape unit and now they are diving into place value within 20! What an exciting week!

Year I

This week, we had a fun and busy time in class! In English, we built on last week's lesson about statements and questions by adding commands and exclamations. The students then used these to write introductions for an instruction text. In Math, we started our unit on Shapes, where everyone enjoyed recognizing 2D and 3D shapes, counting sides and vertices, and practicing their drawing skills. In IPC, we explored the scientific elements of our topic, \*Seeing Light\*, identifying different light sources and learning how day and night occur through a globe activity. We also had a great time discovering the differences between translucent, transparent, and opaque objects. It was a week full of learning and fun!



In English, we have been planning and writing our own Myth and Legend stories! We have been using our imagination and creativity during this as well as our newly learnt writer's skills.

In Maths, we can now use the inverse to check our answers. We completed a revision session before our EOU assessment and starting our new unit - Multiplication and Division!

In IPC, we have been learning about import and exports of different food around the world as well as how charities help countries across the world



Year 4 worked on multiplying and dividing by 7, 11 and 12. They explored patterns that occur, as well as finding the sum of digits. They also reviewed multiplying and dividing by 0,1 and the number by itself

As we work towards producing persuasive texts independently, the children developed a greater understanding of emotive language. They compared texts to see which was more persuasive. Then, Year 4 worked together to plan and write a persuasive text.

Our IPC unit continued with a history focus, which including learning more about the Aztecs and the role of the Spanish in bringing chocolate to Europe.

#### What have we been learning this week



Inspired by the science behind fairground rides, Year 5N students embarked on an exciting journey into the world of forces! In IPC, they worked collaboratively to create loops using pipe tubing, ensuring marbles ran smoothly—a true test of engineering skills. They also conducted friction experiments, discovering which materials created the most resistance. The highlight of the week was exploring centrifugal force by spinning water-filled buckets, proving that constant motion keeps the water in place. SCIENCE IS MAGIC INDEED!

In Maths, students deepened their fraction fluency by mastering the conversion of improper fractions and mixed numbers. They showed fantastic progress in understanding these tricky concepts. Meanwhile, in English, the class prepared for diary writing by exploring first-person perspective and distinguishing between facts and opinions. They are now ready to draft their engaging diary entries.



For IPC this week, Y6 researched on nature vs nurture for the growth and development of a child. They also created a poster each on bad vs good environment. We also learned and understood how the digestive system works. In English, Y6 is doing Argumentative writing. They have completed their mind map or tables for a balanced argument For reading, we continue with our book, titled, The Borrowers and we will move on to Chapter 5&6 .For math, we move on to Fractions B after our unit test, which involves multiplication ..


In this week's EY music lesson, students continued using shakers with different songs, focusing on playing at the right speed, stopping, and starting on cue. Nursery students followed along with videos, while Reception students played according to audio instructions. KS1 students learned basic music elements, including the treble clef, musical and rhythm notation, ostinato patterns, and Kodály hand signs. KS2 students practiced writing tonic triads and rhythmic dictation, where they wrote rhythms as they heard them.



This week in EY, students continued to practice movement games aimed at enhancing their balance and coordination skills. In KS1, students focused on learning the correct technique for the overarm push throw as part of their Fairy Tale Athletics unit. In KS2, students were exposed with an agility test during the fitness unit and concentrated on returning a serve in the badminton unit.

- More High-impact learnings and group activities.






