Dear Secondary Parents,

Over the course of the first term of the academic year so far, we have been audited by ISP professionals for both safeguarding and health & safety. As has been outlined to you previously, we are delighted to have been awarded mastering status with regards to safeguarding, and our recent health & safety audit will also provide us with a similarly positive report, as well as some clear actions to begin to address.

One of the key positives noted was how we support traffic flow and prioritise the safety of our students during both drop-off and pick-up times. You will, I am sure, have noticed teachers on duty each morning and afternoon in their high-viz vests – this, to be clear, is so that students (and parents) can be certain who is actually on duty and who they can turn to if there is an issue.

An action arising from the health & safety audit, however, is the speed of vehicles on and near our school campus. Some cars, it was noted, are driving too quickly during drop-off and pick-up times, so I am asking this week for those who aren't doing so already to drive a little more slowly when approaching and leaving our school. The ideal speed, I would suggest, is 10kmph. Slower, I am sure we would all agree, is better than faster whenever there are children around.

I am also aware that there have been some concerns raised around the traffic lights on the main roads near our school, specifically with regards to how little time is given for cars to turn into the area where our school is located. Please rest assured that we are seeking to address this, as I know that this brings additional challenges to arriving on time each morning.

Our school, of course, opens each morning at 07.00, so it is possible to beat the traffic by dropping children off a little earlier – should that idea work for anyone.

As always, your perspectives on all school matters – but especially perhaps safeguarding and health & safety – are important to us, so please do get in touch if there are points you wish to raise with us directly.
