#### Year I

## Year 2

It's the last week of the term, yet we remain as busy as ever.

The children worked hard at rehearsing for our Christmas Assembly of "Rudolph the red nosed reindeer" and preparing for our IPC Exit Point where we put up a shadow puppet show for our peers, depicting a festival that is light significant. 2C described the significance of light during Deepavali while 2D shared the origin of the Chinese Lantern Festival.

And in between all that, we consolidated our learning in Math and English through Christmas related activities.



## Year 4

Year 4 finished their IPC work with the knowledge assessment and self-reflections. Some children conducted experiments on melting chocolate, which involved using fair tests. It was fantastic to see how much they have learnt and give interesting predictions.

The children consolidated their learning with work on times tables, column subtraction and number puzzles. As there is an increasing focus on problem-solving and reasoning in White Rose, it is important for Year 4 to develop their mental maths and calculation skills in order to apply their knowledge.

Both classes worked very hard to rehearse for the Christmas Assembly and they should be proud of themselves.

# What have we been learning this week



This week, Year 5 reflected on the challenges that they faced when designing and making their fairground rides in IPC. They also considered any improvements they would make to be even more successful. It was wonderful to see the students carefully evaluate their designs and think about their collaboration skills.

In English, students have learnt about limericks, a humorous five-line poem with strict rules about rhymes and rhythm. The students were challenged to write their own limerick about Christmas and to much delight there were cheers and laughter listening to these fantastic poems!

In Maths, Year 5 have used their knowledge of fractions to solve a mathematical mystery as well as embraced the challenge of long division!
