

What have we been learning this week



This week in Nursery, we celebrated a fantastic end-of-term! In IEYC, children enjoyed their Exit Point by engaging in exciting activities like making fruit salad, solving food puzzles, sorting rainbow foods, and practicing yoga for rest and relaxation. In Math, they wrapped up their topics with hands-on activities and completed their End of Block Checkpoint to demonstrate their progress. Literacy was vibrant as children explored I Can Eat a Rainbow through interactive activities. For Phonics, assessments helped us guide them in segmenting and blending CVC words with confidence. It's been a wonderful term full of fun, discovery, and joyful learning!



Year I

This week in Year 1 we have focused on consolidating our learning in English. In IPC students are preparing a celebration for other classes as exit point.

In math students have been learning about number lines to 20, estimating on a number line. Students have also been consolidating their learning preparing for the end of unit assessment.



Year 3

This week in English, we have been completing one of the most important processes of writing - editing! Then, we published our Myth and Legend stories, focusing on cursive handwriting. Finally, we engaged in some peer feedback.

In Maths, we have been completing our arithmetic and reasoning assessments. A goal remains to become more confident with reasoning questions!

In IPC, we prepared for our Exit Point which we will present to the Year 6s. It is fantastic to reflect on all the new knowledge, skills and understanding we have acquired over the term.



In Literacy, we consolidated our learning through fun, hands-on activities inspired by stories and rhymes like Giraffes Can't Dance, Incy Wincy Spider, Jack and the Beanstalk, and I Like Myself. Students engaged in creative reading and writing tasks to reinforce key skills. In Maths, we wrapped up topics with interactive learning activities and completed our End of Block Checkpoint to showcase their mastery.

For IEYC, our exciting Exit Point saw us visiting different year groups in Early Years, followed by student reflections on their journey.

We ended the week by celebrating the students' achievements for the term.



Year 2

We started the week with our assessments in Arithmetic and Reasoning & Problem-solving, followed with consolidating learning.

In English we focus on our reading comprehension skills at the beginning of the week, and ending the week with learning and reciting a poem titled "I'm not afraid of the dark".

In IPC, we are focusing on festivals around the world that use different light sources as a means of celebration. We will explore in depth at least one festival and showcase our learning to our peers through a shadow puppet play.



Year 4

Year 4 rounded off their IPC unit on 'Chocolate' with an exit point that involved Year 3 visiting both classrooms to view presentations. We also had the opportunity to visit Year 5, as part of their exit point. Everyone loved the trip to the chocolate museum. It was a great opportunity for the children to review their learning, see artefacts from the Mayan and Aztec Empires, as well as make their own chocolate houses.

The children have continued to practice their times tables, mental maths and rehearse for the Christmas Assembly. See you there!
