This week in school we have benefited from a number of external partnerships that we have actively sought to develop over the course of the academic year so far. On Wednesday, we were visited by professionals from Joshua Rayan communications so that members of our primary & secondary councils could increase their knowledge and understanding of potential local sustainability initiatives ahead of our ESG initiative beginning later this term. The session was wonderfully delivered and our students gained a great deal from it.

Today, we hosted another local professional – this a time a nutritionist – who spoke to selected students from Years 6 & 7 about the importance of healthy eating, specifically with regards to high performance in sports. The students selected were those who have either participated in sports events or who have been members of sports teams so far this academic year. Again, this session was of great use to us as a school and helped our students to gain new perspectives on issues which are clearly of great importance to us all in our Straits International School Rawang community.

Also today, although a little later in the day, we welcomed professional coaches from Southampton Football Club Academy Malaysia into our school in order to deliver a free session to our budding footballers. Today's session is a prelude to a longer-term arrangement between Straits International School Rawang and Southampton FC with regards to providing the young people in our care with high-quality football coaching from an English Premier League football club. Southampton FC have produced a number of very well-known professional football players over the years through their academy programme – including Gareth Bale, Ben White, Alan Shearer & Luke Shaw, to name but some – so our Straits students will be in very good hands here.

Clearly, we are seeking to be an outward-facing school who are not only serving the community but also making the most of the immense professional talent within it. If there are any other parents who feel that they may have connections
