What have we been learning this week



The first week of Term 2.1 was a fantastic start for our nursery students! They enjoyed settling in with exciting activities like a nature hunt, where they explored leaves and twigs, fun hands-on number games to strengthen their numeracy skills, and outdoor group play that encouraged teamwork and physical development. The children also expressed their creativity through art using natural materials and participated enthusiastically in storytime, boosting their imagination and language skills. It was a joyful and engaging week, setting the tone for a term full of exploration and learning!



Welcome to Term 2, Reception! Although it was just the first week, lots of learning took place. It was a productive and exciting start.

Students were introduced to We're Going on a Bear Hunt. They sequenced the story using beginning, middle, and end, recorded stories through drawing, and practiced new vocabulary in discussions and role-play. Students explored numbers 0-5, learned perceptual subitizing, and represented numbers in different ways. Students began exploring nature and brought their favorite soft toys for the Entry Point. They enjoyed outdoor learning and made new friends!



Welcome back!

It has been wonderful to have the students back in class and getting back into our classroom routines. We started our new IPC unit 'Buildings' as part of our entry point students had a challenging tasks for trying to build a structure using cards! It was great to see the perseverance the students had. In English, students have started learning about traditional tales and features of traditional tales. It has been wonderful to see their creativity in English.

In Maths students have started to learn different strategies to add within in 20.



This week, the children revisited the four sentence types from Term 1 and learned to differentiate between common and proper nouns. They began exploring the term's reading text, Fred the Wizard in Training, and practiced using a dictionary. In Maths, the new unit on Money introduced Malaysian currency and British pounds and pence, with an emphasis on counting in 2s, 5s, and 10s to aid calculations. For IPC, the term's unit, It's Shocking!, kicked off with an engaging Entry Point activity to develop observational skills, followed by a Knowledge Harvest on electricity.



It has been wonderful seeing all the Year 3s back in school this week. They have settled back into the routines and expectations seamlessly.

This week has been full of new learning! In IPC, we started our new unit, 'Let's Plant It'. We enjoyed sharing the knowledge we already have about plants and taking a nature walk around school.

In English, we are learning about non-chronological reports. We created story maps about bees and answered questions to gain more understanding.

Finally, in Maths, we have been thinking about multiplication, related calculations and reasoning questions.



We were delighted to welcome the children back to Year 4 this week. It seems like everyone had an enjoyable and relaxing break.

In Maths, we have begun our unit on 'Length and Perimeter'. The children found equivalent measures of length by converting kilometres to metres and vice versa.

In English, the children read and performed a playscript for the well-known fairy tale 'Three Little Pigs'.

Our new IPC unit 'Inventions that changed the world' began with an entry point and knowledge harvest involving children suggesting usage of antique objects. They conducted a survey and graphed the results to see which was most important.

What have we been learning this week



NEW YEAR, SAME ROUTINES!

Welcome back to Term 2, Year 5!

In Maths, students are working on the Multiplication and Division B unit, focusing on multiplying two-digit numbers using the area model and column method. These strategies help develop accuracy and problem-solving skills. In Reading, we've introduced our new novel, The Firework

Maker's Daughter. Students began by making predictions and exploring how different types of fireworks look, building excitement for the story ahead.

In English, we've been reviewing grammar through practice activities to strengthen foundational skills. We're also starting a narrative poetry unit, beginning with The Willow Pattern, a poem told through intricate designs on ceramic plates. Students are identifying the key features of the narrative poem. In IPC, our new unit, What a Wonderful World, kicked off with an exciting Entry Point. Students are designing 2025 calendars featuring stunning natural wonders, combining creativity and geography.

Here's to a term full of creativity and learning! 🌟



Year 6 kicked start their term 2.1 with their holiday postcard writing and presentation for English, followed by fiction writing where they have to complete the story given to them using their own ideas. They will also be introduced to poetry writing. For IPC, the topic is Full Power where the students will learn about harvesting different sources of power and focus on electricity. We started with Entry Point with static energy experiment and knowledge harvest on electrical appliances and it's usage. For Reading, we started a new book titled The Day The Screens Went Blank. This is a fun and easy read as they will enjoy the jokes and humor. For Maths, we continued from T1.2 chapter, Converting Units where they learned about miles and kilometers, followed by imperial measures and unit tests to finish off the topic.

Meanwhile, KS2 students participated in a variety of enjoyable warm-up games and activities during their welcome week, preparing them for the upcoming Athletics and Basketball units.
