ENGLISH

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	First Language English: Students began exploring short stories by studying Freytag's Pyramid. They used what they learned to start planning their own stories, incorporating the key elements of the structure.
	English Second Language: Students focused on the key words of transport systems and created a timeline for the history of transportation.
Y8	First Language English: Students began their exploration of poetry by writing their own poem, playing with language, meaning and expression. They have also started reading A Poison Tree by William Blake.
	English Second Language: Students focused on the key words of advertising and discussed the power of advertisements.
Y9	First Language English: This week, students gave presentations about a book they have recently read and enjoyed. They then spent some time researching the structure and language of poetry.
	English Second Language: Students focused on the key words of medical science and applyed in real-life situations.
	First Language English: Students read selected passages and practised various skills, including looking for explicit and implicit ideas, directed writing, and comprehension.
Y10	Literature in English: Students focused on Chapters 14 and 15 of 'Things Fall Apart', with an aim to write a detailed 'SEIZE' paragraph about each chapter.
	English Second Language: Students created a CV for job application in the future.
Y11	First Language English/Literature in English: No lesson due to Mock exams.
	English Second Language: No lesson due to Mock exams.



MATHEMATICS

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students used bar model to find equivalent fraction. They also learned to order fractions using multiple methods.
Y8	Students learned on converting fractions to an equivalent decimals. They also learned the difference between terminating and recurring decimals.
Y9	Students learned to find the area and circumference of circles.
Y10	Students learned on expanding 2 and 3 brcackets as well as finding the square of binomials.

Y10 Add Math	Students learned to solve equations involving modulus using algebraic and graphical method.
Y11 Add Math	The IGCSE Mock exams for 2025 are currently being administered.
