Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	In First Language English, student have begun to respond academically to prose. They have formed first impressions of characters, and gather evidence to back up their opinions.
	In ESL, students compared famous cities in the world using comparative adjectives and adverbs.
Y8	In First Language English, students have begun exploring William Blakes poetry. They have compared and contrasted two poems and begun looking at English concepts such as Implicit and Explicit meaning.
	In ESL, students designed the layout of a supermarket with the labels of various aisles.
	In First Language English, students have been exploring poetry analysis by reading and responding to 'Dulce Et Decorum Est' and 'Bayonet Charge'.
Y9	In ESL, students discussed three reading articles related to a young inventor, extinction and ecosystem.
	In First Language English, students read a passage about a character and completed directed writing in the form of a radio interview based on the passage. They also explored tenor and vehicle within metaphors.


