This week has been an exciting and productive one for our EAL students across all year groups! Each class engaged in enriching activit<mark>ies that strengthened their</mark> language skills while making learning fun and interactive.

### Year 1 – Developing Writing Skills 差

Our Year 1 students focused on sentence writing, describing animals using simple adjectives. They worked diligently on structuring their sentences correctly and using proper punctuation. Their writing skills are progressing remarkably well, and we are proud of their continuous improvement.

### Year 2 – Exploring Vehicles and Imaginative Writing 🚗 🛪 🚊

Year 2 had an exciting week learning about different types of vehicles. They unleashed their creativity by designing their own imaginary vehicles and writing sentences about them. Each student then confidently presented their work to the class, strengthening both their writing and presentation skills. The enthusiasm and teamwork displayed were truly commendable!

The ISP Chess Masters tournament is an exciting competition where students from different schools come together to showcase their strategic thinking and problem-solving skills through the game of chess. This event encourages players to sharpen their minds, develop new strategies, and enjoy the thrill of competitive play. Below is the journey of our Year 5 student, Glendon, as he shares his experiences, challenges, and achievements in the tournament (by: Ms. Shakila)

#### <u>A Personal Journey of Glendon</u>

#### When did you first learn to play chess?

I first started playing chess back in 2022 at home. After a two-year break, I returned to the game in 2024 with renewed enthusiasm.

#### How does playing chess help you improve your thinking skills?

Chess has helped me think more clearly and strategically. It's not just about playing a game, it has also improved my overall thinking skills, helping me approach problems with more focus.

#### What was the most exciting part of the ISP tournament for you?

The most exciting part of the ISP chess tournament was the first round. I won my very first game of the tournament, which gave me a huge boost of confidence!



#### How did you prepare for the competition?

In preparation for the competition, I played more chess games and focused on practicing my gambits and openings. This helped me get ready for the challenges I would face in the tournament.

#### When did you feel most challenged during the tournament?

I felt most challenged when I played against a senior in the tournament. I honestly thought I was going to lose, but I managed to win a few of the games, which felt like a real accomplishment!

#### What do you enjoy the most about ISP Chess?

The best part of the ISP chess tournament is the sense of enjoyment I get from winning a few games and making critical moves. It's always thrilling when a well-thought-out strategy pays off!

## What have we been learning this week



This week was full of exciting discoveries! The children zoomed around building their gross motor skills, mixed soil and water to create squishy mud and became little chefs by designing their own restaurants. In Math, they had fun exploring shapes, solving tricky inset jigsaws, and playing games to understand positions like in, on, and under. For Literacy, they dived into The Three Little Pigs, chattering away in longer sentences, acting out the story and even trying their hands at writing letters like real authors!



This week, students engaged in a variety of enriching activities across Literacy, Mathematics, and IEYC. In Literacy, they explored the enchanting story The Gruffalo, using new vocabulary in discussions, recording stories through picture drawing and mark-making, sequencing the story into beginning, middle, and end, editing the story map, and orally editing and retelling a new story to foster creativity and expression. In Mathematics, they built on prior learning by exploring pairsodd and even—while being introduced to doubling as 'twice as many.' They recognized doubles through patterns, pictures, and manipulatives, physically created doubles through markmaking, and combined two groups to find the total amount. In IEYC, students engaged in exciting activities, identifying patterns in nature through artwork and painting, creating a bird feeder to learn about caring for the environment, exploring musical instruments made from recycled materials, and examining fruit and vegetable textures through printing artwork. It was a week filled with creativity, exploration, and hands-on learning!



In English - students have been working on creating and planning their own traditional tale as part of their writing assessment. In maths - students have been working on partitioning numbers within 50 and learning to use a numberline. IPC - In IPC students have been working on their final learning tasks which have been focused on testing out the strength of different materials.



English – Children completed their planning for non-chronological reports and began their writing assessment with support from word banks and sentence starters. Maths – We explored making equal groups, the 2 times table, and dividing by 2. IPC – In our final It's Shocking lesson, children compared how electricity is used worldwide and completed a Knowledge Assessment to reflect on their learning.

### Year 3

This week in English, we have been writing non chronological reports independently. We have learnt a lot about different insects over this unit, linking with 'Let's Plant It', and now are focusing on ants.

In Maths, we are becoming experts in equivalent lengths of metres/ centimetres and centimetres/ millimetres as well as comparing lenghts. We also measured and compared the length of our feet!

In IPC, we have explored the benefits of a plant-based diet and different superfoods. We have been researching and presenting our findings.



In Maths, we have worked on informal and formal written methods of multiplication including multiplying a 3-digit number by a 1-digit number. The children have also reviewed the times tables. In English, we have delved deeper into the features of newspaper articles. Having worked on direct & reported speech and formal language, the children have explored introductory paragraphs. In preparation for writing their own article, the children researched an invention. In IPC, there has been a lot of practical work taking place with children making toys and wallpaper.

## What have we been learning this week



What an immersive week we've had in Year 5!

Our adventure began with a trip to Putrajaya Wetland Park Studio, where students explored different biomes, learned about extinct species, and reflected on environmental conservation. A highlight was observing flamingos up close at the pond! In IPC, students created lapbooks to present their findings on landforms and bodies of water. We also dive into our Science unit where they did hands-on activity with Oreo cookies to model the phases of the moon.

In Maths, we wrapped up our Fractions unit by consolidating our knowledge through problemsolving and an end-of-topic assessment. In English, students unleashed their creativity by bringing classroom objects to life through personification. They crafted imaginative sentences and developed them into engaging narrative poems, using vivid language and poetic techniques to enhance their writing.

#### Year 6

This week in English, we have been innovating our class book story, 'The Day the Screens Went Blank' into our own narrative stories by a different perspective.

In Maths we have introduced ourselves to equations in our algebra topic.

In IPC, we are starting to prepare for our Exit Point by designing games which include an electrical circuit.


Music
