Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	In First Language English, students worked on Flash Fiction where they practiced the skill of showing not telling.
17	In ESL, students summarised the story of ancient Olympics and identified the key points.
	In First Language English, students explored songs as poetry and began using the analysitical skills explored this term in preparation for the Major Assessement.
Y8	In ESL, students wrote a script about challenges at school for a call-in radio programme.
Y9	In First Language English, students did a deep dive into the world water crisis, improving their notemaking skills and using these notes to write a persuasive speech about the issue.
	In ESL, students explained the rights and responsibilites of a citizen and wrote a list about it.
Y10	In First Language English, students have been exploring scripts and stage directions, practising their speaking & listening skills and considering how writers' choices can have differing effects on the reader.
	In ESL, students wrote an information about the university they wish to enter and gave opinion on education.

Y7	Students learnt about the Spring festival in Russia and answered questions on it. They also learnt about Compound nouns and completed a quiz on it.

Children use it for casual conversations, emotional support, and homework help, though the responses aren't always reliable. They also engage in creative roleplay, using chatbots for storytelling, acting out scenarios, and simulating conversations with fictional characters—an entertaining activity that can sometimes blur the line between reality and fiction

Children may develop emotional attachments to Al chatbots, treating them as real friends or therapists. This can lead to dependency on Al for emotional support rather than seeking real human connections. Moreover, Al chatbots store and collect data that may be shared with third parties. If a platform experiences a data breach, sensitive information could be leaked or exploited.






Children may believe Al-generated responses are always factual, even when they contain harmful stereotypes or unverified advice on sensitive topics like mental health.

Some users exploit Al chatbots to create harmful or manipulative roleplay scenarios, which can normalize unsafe behavior. Additionally, online predators may use Al-generated interactions to groom minors, making it harder for children to recognize unsafe situations

Help your child recognize signs of manipulation, bias, or unsafe interactions in Al chatbots, and encourage them to talk to a trusted adult if they ever feel uncomfortable. Additionally, stay informed about Al platform updates and potential risks, enable chat history deletion and content filtering, and use parental controls to manage app usage and data privacy.





Talk to your child about how AI is not human—it doesn't have emotions or real understanding. Encourage them to think critically about its responses and remind them that not everything AI says is true. If they would like to use AI chatbots, explore together and set rules on sharing personal details or engaging in overly personal chats. It is best to promote screen-free time and real-life interactions to prevent over-reliance on AI for companionship.


















We are looking into renaming our Wings so that they more accurately reflect the amazing learning that takes place in each area of our school.


