ENGLISH

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
¥7	English 1 - Students have been getting better at identifying and understanding character motivations. They have built character profiles that will inform thier own writing when commenting on Romeo and Juliet
	English 2 - Students produced a slide presentation about different jobs in the world, looking at responsibilies, education and skill, average salary, working environment and future job outlook.
Y8	English 1 - Students have been getting better at identifying conflict, with evidence, within AMNSD. Students have used this skill to build PEA paragraphs and self assess those paragraphs, giving useful feedback to themselves.
	English 2 - Students created a slide presentation about an interview with a historical figure, eg. Queen Elizabeth I, Adolf Hitler, Vincent Van Gogh etc.
Y9	English 1 - This week, students read Chapter 3 and 4 of 'Animal Farm'. They analysed the use of rhetorical devices by comparing Squealer's speech to propaganda, and completed a formative piece of analytical writing.
	English 2 - Students designed a slide presentation about an entry of a photography competition.



PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES ENGLISH

Y10	First Language English - Students wrote a formative piece of directed writing in the form of a biography. They read various types of text (novel, play & poetry) and answered reading questions on each, exploring the use of language and its effects.
	English as a Second Language - Students created a slide presentation about volunteering organisations, eg. WWF etc.
	English Literature - Students consolidated their knowledge of 'A Midsummer Night's Dream' Act 3 Scene 2 by writing an analytical mini essay. We then read Act 4 Scene 1 and answered some comprehension & inference questions as we read.
Y11	First Language English - Students spent this week's lessons recapping the contents of all of the papers in preparation for this and next week's English exams.
	English as a Second Language - Students completed IGCSE Englsih Paper 1 of reading and writing.



MATHEMATICS

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students learned about vertical and horizontal graphs parallel with x y axes.
Y8	Students learned on linear function and identifying gradient and y-intercept.
¥9	Students learned to calculate compound interest and earnings from daily financial tasks.
Y10	Students learned on simplifying ratio, solving word problem involving ratio and learned on application of maps and scale.
YII	Students attempted on targetted paper 3 and 4 questions and revisited all the formulas.
Y10 Add Math	Students learned to find the length of arc and area of sectors using radian.
Y11 Add Math	Students practiced some Paper 1 targetted questions.



SCIENCE

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
¥7	Students learned about microorganisms, exploring their harmful and beneficial characteristics, and created their own original bacteria and virus designs.
Y8	Students learned about chemical equations and how to balance them correctly.
¥9	Students learned about elements that makes up carbohydrates, proteins and lipids.
	Combined Science - Students learned and practiced answering Paper 6 planning question on photosynthesis.
Y10	Physics - Students learned about dispersion of light and electromagnetic waves.

This Week's Topic: How to Support English Communication at Home

Whether your child is just beginning to learn English or already using it in class, your support at home makes a big difference. Here are some simple and effective ways to help your child strengthen their English speaking and listening skills:

Tip #1: Create a "Language Time" at Home Choose 10-20 minutes a day to speak only in English together. This could be during dinner, while playing a game, or walking to school. Keep it relaxed and fun!
Tip #2: Use English TV Shows or YouTube Videos Choose age-appropriate cartoons or videos with clear speech. Watch together and pause to ask, "What do you think they said?" or "Can you say that too?"

✓ Tip #3: Play Word Games in English Try games like "I Spy," charades, or naming items around the house in English. This builds vocabulary in a playful way.

✓ Tip #4: Encourage Speaking Without Correcting Too Much It's okay if your child makes mistakes. Praise their effort and gently model the correct sentence without interrupting.

✓ Tip #5: Use a Language Journal Together Have your child draw or write one thing in English every day (even one word or sentence). You can write with them or help translate from your home language.






