What have we been learning this week





This week in nursery, we're enjoying the story Snail Trail, helping children develop listening skills, recall key events, identify parts of a book, and spot letters in words. In maths, we're exploring shape, space, and measure through Puzzle 5, matching objects to their shadows, exploring different viewpoints, and creating simple routes with lines and curves. We're also starting Pattern 5, where children sing their own songs and clap to a beat. As part of our IEYC themes All Shapes and Sizes and Model Makers, we're diving into circle vision, creating spiralling shells, testing how we see the world, and building tall with our model-making skills.

This week in Literacy, children enthusiastically learned the rhyme "I'm a Giant T-Rex," using actions to retell it and identifying rhyming words. They labeled rhyming pictures and practiced spelling by segmenting sounds.

In Maths, we wrapped up the "How Many Now?" unit by exploring subtraction and completed the end checkpoint. Then, we began the "Manipulate, Compose & Decompose" unit, selecting and rotating shapes.

In IEYC, we explored fossils and dinosaur dilemmas, creating 3D fossil art, writing fact files, and building group dinosaur heads. Children also programmed toys and made creative missing dinosaur posters.

Have a restful long weekend—roar into rest and relax!



Year I

In Maths, this week year 1 has been focusing on understanding quarters and being able identify quarters in quantities and objects. We will be wrapping up this unit with a end of block assessment today.

In English, students have continued developing their knowledge of fantasy story by creating and describing a fantasy setting. Year 1 has also identified fantasy elements in stories.

In IPC, students have continued to learn about their senses with a focus on understanding that we need more than one sense to stay safe.



Year 2

In English, we've continued our work using Mrs. Armitage on Wheels as our inspiration. This week, our focus has been on grammar. The children revisited conjunctions from last term before being introduced to time connectives. They also learned how to use the suffix -ly to turn adjectives into adverbs.

In Maths, we've started exploring fractions. The children learned the difference between unit and non-unit fractions and discovered that one half equals two quarters (1/2 = 2/4). We ended the week learning to recognise and find three-quarters of different shapes and quantities.

Our IPC lessons this week focused on History. The children explored how people travelled in the past and created timelines to show when various land, water, and air vehicles were invented. We also looked at how mythical characters from legends got around, and the week ended with a creative task: designing their imaginative vehicles inspired by films.



Year 3

The highlight of Year 3's week was our digestive system investigation during IPC! We headed to the Science Room to explore how the digestive system works. We enjoyed our hands on learning - even though things got a bit messy as we explored how our teeth, stomach, small intestine and large intestine break down food!

In Maths, we have begun our new unit on Money. We have learnt about pounds/ pence, how to convert and how to add and subtract money.

In English, we have learnt many new skills to use in our explanation texts, such as: impersonal language, fronted adverbials and cause/ effect conjunctions. We are now writing our own explanation texts about the water cycle.



Vear L

In English, Year 4 continued to explore the features of fantasy fiction through the story of 'Alice in Wonderland'. The children learnt about quests, personification and subordinating conjunctions. Then, they described a fantasy setting using all of the techniques covered.

Our 'Money' unit in maths began this week with an introduction to British coins and notes. The children worked on converting amounts between pounds to pence and vice versa, as well as calculating with money. This short unit will be concluded next week.

In IPC, our 'Time and Place, Earth and Space' unit focused on the Earth and Moon this week. Year 4 explored the reason why temperatures vary across the world. Then, they began to work on the phases of the Moon.

What have we been learning this week



This week in Year 5, we evaluated different sources of information to learn about significant people from the past. We researched important historical figures from the past century, from 100–300 years ago, and from the last millennium. We also explored how inventions have developed over time and how they have changed people's lives.

In English, we identified the features of non-chronological reports and practised using parenthesis in our writing. We also enjoyed reading Chapter 2 of Beowulf.

In Maths, we continued our Shape unit by drawing lines and angles accurately, calculating angles around a point and on a straight line, exploring lengths and angles in shapes, and identifying regular and irregular polygons.



Year 6 started their IPC: Mission to Mars by comparing Mars and Venus .We also discovered the difference between mass, weight and gravity. We did an experiment using the force meter to measure the force applied on mass and finally learned about buoyancy .

In English, we started learning about the DASH paragraph for science fiction writing.

For Maths, we started a new chapter, statistics, learning the all the different types of graphs and how to interpret them.

We finally ended our week with our field trip to Immersify, Kl!

KS1 students are exploring animal sounds using percussion instruments. KS2 students are focusing on cultural rhythms, including African, Latin American, and Brazilian Samba styles.



PE

This week in EY & KS1, students developed their hand-eye and foot-eye coordination through a variety of multi-skills stations using different types of balls and equipment. In KS2, students developed their dribbling, passing and shooting under pressure in the football unit.

🦙 This Week in EAL 🦮

This week in EAL, all year groups participated in some truly wonderful and creative learning activities. Each year level focused on specific skills to enhance their vocabulary, grammar, and writing abilities while encouraging self-expression and multilingual appreciation.

- ■ Year 1 explored the topic of food in an exciting and hands-on way. Students learned to describe how different foods taste and look using a variety of descriptive adjectives. They also participated in a fun speaking activity, where they practiced full sentences while talking about their favourite foods. This helped strengthen their sentence structure, vocabulary, and speaking confidence in a supportive environment.
- Year 2 focused on the theme of hobbies. They explored different types of hobbies people enjoy around the world and practiced reading comprehension using four simple strategies: underlining key information, reading the question carefully, going back to the text, and checking their answers. They also had a chance to practice their speaking skills by discussing their own hobbies in pairs and groups, which encouraged them to express their ideas in full sentences.
- ✓ Year 3 & 4 learned about the figurative language concept of personification. They discovered how to give human qualities to objects or animals a creative activity that sparked their imagination and expanded their vocabulary. Students also applied some helpful reading comprehension strategies, such as identifying keywords and using context clues. They wrote their own personification sentences, which they proudly shared with the class, making the lesson both meaningful and fun.
- C Year 5 & 6 delved into a non-fiction reading comprehension lesson centered on the wonders of marine life. They explored new topic-specific vocabulary, discussed their ideas in small groups, and answered comprehension questions using a step-by-step approach. The lesson also included a speaking component, where students practiced summarizing what they had learned and shared interesting facts with their peers. This balanced approach of reading, vocabulary building, and speaking gave students a well-rounded learning experience.

It has been a productive and enriching week, with all students demonstrating great effort and enthusiasm. We are incredibly proud of their progress and dedication to improving their language skills.

Thank you to all parents for your continuous support! We look forward to another exciting week of learning ahead.




Celebrating Multilingualism in Our Classroom

I have participated in numerous national and international tournaments, performing at a level I am extremely proud of. Chess is something I am very passionate about, and I feel it runs in my blood. One of my greatest accomplishments was playing against a Chess Grandmaster in 2024 (ISP Chess Master) when I was only 7 years old. This opportunity was made possible through a collaboration with SIS Rawang, where I am also part of the school's chess team. 








Small Steps for a sustainable future


