This week, we are excited to focus on a simple but powerful way to build language skills at home — through daily conversations around the dinner table. Talking about everyday experiences in both your home language and in English helps your child connect meaning, build vocabulary, and express ideas with confidence.

Whether your child is just beginning to learn English or is already multilingual, dinner conversations offer natural, low-pressure moments to practice speaking, listening, and thinking in multiple languages.

This Week's Focus: Daily Conversation Starters

Here are some easy questions you can ask at dinner — first in your home language, then repeat or discuss them again in English. This supports translanguaging — using your full language repertoire to make learning more meaningful.
