# **Helping Your Child Navigate Friendship Challenges**

Here are some simple things you can do as a parent to help your child navigate these moments with confidence and care.



#### Listen and validate their feelings

Give your child space to talk. Avoid interrupting or jumping in with solutions too quickly. Let them know it is okay to feel sad, confused or frustrated about what happened.



#### Guide them, avoiding fixing

Help your child think through possible next steps, rather than solving the issue for them.




#### **Model Kind Boundaries**

It is okay to say "no" or walk away from behaviour that feels hurtful or uncomfortable. Setting boundaries does not make them unkind, it teaches self-respect. Remind your child that they can still be polite while standing up for themselves.

### **Reinforce Positive Friendship Skills**

Talk about what makes a healthy friendship: being honest, kind, respectful and supportive. Encourage your child to look for these traits in others and to practise them too. Also, reassure them that it is okay to have more than one group of friends. They do not need to limit themselves to just one circle.



#### Don't Force Reconciliation

Not all friendships are meant to last and that is okay. Let your child know they do not have to stay close to someone who consistently makes them feel small or uncomfortable. Encourage forgiveness when appropriate, but allow space if needed. What matters most is helping your child feel emotionally safe and confident in their choices.

Theme: Celebrating Reading in Every Language!

E Bilingual Book Reviews – Connecting Language, Literacy, and Identity

At Straits Rawang, we believe that every language a child speaks is a powerful learning tool. This week, our focus is on Bilingual Book Reviews, an initiative designed to encourage students to read books in their home language and English and reflect on them through writing or speaking.

Reading in both languages helps students: Strengthen vocabulary and comprehension Connect their cultural identity with academic learning Build confidence in using multiple languages

how Can Families Support This at Home?

Here are simple ways you can take part:

Choose a book your child enjoys in their home language or in English.

Read together, or let your child read independently depending on their level.

Ask your child to write or record:

What is the book about?

Who are the characters?

Why do they like (or not like) the book?

Encourage them to do this in both languages. It could be:

A short-written review

A video/audio recording

A drawing with simple sentences

💬 Example Prompts (You Can Use These at Home):

#### In English:

"My favourite part of the book was..."

"The story is about..."

"I recommend this book because..."

In Home Language:

Let your child express ideas freely – even better if they can translate a sentence or two into English later!

#### **ILOS ISP ARTIST**

The students explored the concept of "Beyond Borders," with this group focusing specifically on flowers as both a visual and symbolic element. Their work challenged traditional boundaries through the use of mixed media, layered surfaces, and fragmented compositions, effectively representing themes of growth, fragility, and transformation.

This exploration has seamlessly transitioned into their ILOS ISP ARTIST program under the broader theme of "Nature." Building on their previous investigations, students will continue to examine botanical forms through in-depth artist research, observational drawing, and media experimentation. Their sustained focus on flowers offers a rich platform for personal interpretation and creative development. In their compositions, the theme of "Nature" is explored through the lens of "Beyond Borders," with flowers at the center. The artworks employ monochrome pencil shading alongside selective color to create a compelling contrast between vibrant life and fading forms. Through layered textures and tonal depth, the pieces evoke both beauty and ephemerality. The symbolic use of flowers extends beyond visual and ecological interpretations, providing a strong conceptual base for further artistic exploration in the students' ILOS ISP ARTIST journey.







If their account runs low, they can still collect food coupons from the Finance Office — but a quick top-up keeps everything hassle-free.














# Small Steps for a sustainable future


